Certain medications called Beta Blockers, which may be used to control high blood pressure, heart irregularities, migraines, glaucoma or cataracts, **may also cause chest tightness in asthmatics, or may badly affect allergy injections.**

Please inform your Physician or Allergy Injection Nurse if you are presently taking, or in the future are placed on any of the following medications, which are in the Beta Blocker category:
